

ST AGNES SCHOOL P-6 DRESS CODE

The dress code for St Agnes School P-6 reflects our school pride and our strong community feel. The dress standard is a result of parents and the school working in partnership.

The school expects students to wear clothing within the dress code. The main benefits of a dress code are:

- pride in appearing as a member of the St Agnes School and community
- reducing the social pressure to follow fashion trends
- lowering the cost of students' school clothing
- being appropriately dressed for various physical activities

Dress Code Policy

Short sleeve t-shirt/ polo shirt	Bottle green or school uniform polo shirt
Bottoms: shorts, track pants, skorts, appropriate leggings	Plain black (shorts, skorts to be thigh length minimum)
Long sleeve windcheater or jacket	Bottle green or school uniform top
Long sleeve under t-shirt/polo	White, black or bottle green
Cotton school dress	School check (white and green), (bike shorts only to be worn under school dress)
Coats worn in the school yard	Bottle green or black
Jewellery/Hair	Watch, simple stud/sleeper earrings, medic alerts only. Plain hairbands/ties/scrunchies in school colours only. Long hair should be tied back to prevent injury and reduce risk of head lice spreading, and off the face for clear line of sight
Hat	Bottle green broad brimmed or bucket. Hats are to be worn from 1 st September – 30 th April. All hats must have cord/neck ties removed
Beanie	St Agnes logo
Footwear	Closed toe shoes. Preferably black, appropriate for physical activity. Plain coloured socks, preferably black or white.

Uniform items and hats are available from the school front office.

Year 6 students are able to wear year 6 senior tops. Captains are able to wear the Captains t-shirts when providing school leadership. State Sport team jumpers/jackets may be worn <u>only</u> for the week following the event they were received.

Unacceptable items

- Skorts/shorts/dresses shorter than mid-thigh
- Active wear including bike shorts and skins
- Themed socks
- Jeans (including black jeans), denim and jeggings
- Jewellery other than mentioned previously
- Brand name items
- Hair decorations
- Unnatural hair colours
- Make up, including nail polish
- Temporary tattoos, transfers
- Caps
- Sleeveless tops, string tops, crop tops
- Thongs/rollers sneakers

Acceptable



- ✓ No branding on shorts
- ✓ Plain shoes and socks
- ✓ Mid-thigh length shorts

The dress code in operation

The school colours are bottle green and white. Clothing which are in school colours but display brands, slogans etc are not considered to be within the dress code.

All students are strongly encouraged to wear the dress code without variation.

Unavoidable temporary variations in the school dress code must be advised in writing.

When not in dress code, students may be given a dress code t-shirt or jacket to wear for the day and return to the front office at the end of the day. Students will be given a form to inform their parents' that they were not wearing dress code clothing. This is to be signed and returned to the school.

If a student continues to dress outside of the school code, the leadership team will liaise with the student's family directly.
